Nichola Wade - A reading from the Book of Genesis

Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

15 After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' ² But Abram said, 'O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' ³ And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' ⁴ But the word of the Lord came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' ⁵ He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' ⁶ And he believed the Lord; and the Lord^[b]reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Oven warming is possible. **PARISH EMAILS** – We understand that some parishioners, especially those who use Shaw, have not been receiving the Parish Emails that are sent out through our website system (usually from admin@parishcs.ca). There are usually at least two per week, sometimes more. We have taken steps to try and resolve this issue at our end but these problems may be directly related to Shaw.

If you had previously been receiving emails but have not been receiving them recently, The advice from our Diocesan Digital Communications staff member is as follows:

- 1. Ask the parishioners who aren't receiving the emails to log into their shaw.ca email, review their spam filter settings, and adjust the filter sensitivity.
- 2. If problems continue, have your parishioner contact Shaw Home directly for assistance. Shaw can do email traces and figure out what error code is being sent out. The most common error is Error: 550 5.1.1 which means the recipient email does not exist or is invalid. I would recommend making sure there isn't a typo in the email address. The phone number to give people to call is 1.888.472.2222.
